




From 2002 through 2019 there were intermittent periods of growth for the Foundation as assets were transferred to the ownership of the organization. At it's largest during the first 17 years, the Foundation held just over \$25MM in assets and real property.

With the gift from Gert's estate, over the last 5 years the Roundhouse Foundation's endowment grew by over 1,466%





How we're communicating and centering community



The importance of standing alongside rural, remote and Indigenous communities in Oregon Roundhouse Foundation is a private family foundation based in Sisters, Oregon, founded in 2002. They provide grant and other supports to rural, remote and Indigenous communities across

Oregon. Last year the Foundation issued over 750 grants to over 600 organizations; and within the last 5 years has distributed just over \$55MM within rural Oregon. On February 18, Roundhouse Foundation, Executive Director, Erin Borla shared a statement from

the Foundation to their grant partners regarding the recent federal impacts to communities the Foundation serves. A piece of that statement is below: With the new federal political administration, there are many questions about how Roundhouse Foundation's grant partners may be impacted by federal issues. I wanted to share how we are working to



center the communities we serve during these tumultuous times. We will do our best to share accurate The National Council on Nonprofits is working collectively with their state associations—including the Nonprofit Association of The Induordal Council on Nonprofiles is working collectively with their state associations—incluaing the Nonprofil Association of Oregon (NAO)—to be a leading source of timely, calm and fact-based resources for nonprofiles regarding federal challenges, executive and the state of the state o orders, and other information. NAO also offers opportunities for professional development, technical assistance and advocacy

oracts, and other information. NAO also offers opportunities for professional development, technical assistance and advocacy throughout the year. We will be providing memberships to NAO for eligible 2024 and 2025 Roundhouse Foundation grant partners. Foundation staff have been spending the last several weeks listening to concerns of those we work with across the state. We have been gathering information and stories of those directly impacted, and consulting with decision makers as we can. I will be in Washington

I will be in vv asnington D.C. in the next few weeks in hopes to discuss the challenges recent federal events have had on our grant partners and the communities We recognize that several organizations have been impacted by the restriction, pause, and cancellations of federal grant programs. As v e recognize inal several organizations nave been impacied by the restriction, pause, and cancellations of Jeaeral grant programs. As many of you know, it would not be feasible for private philanthropic institutions to backfill the massive holes left by the loss of federal government support. That being said, Roundhouse is gathering with other philanthropic leaders across the region to determine what

support can be offered at this time, collectively.


